ORDINANCE 109

AN PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OF ANIMALS OR MALE FOWL ORDINANCE CAPABLE OF CROWING WITHIN THE BOUNDRIES OF THE TOWN OF HUGO, COLORADO AND REGULATION THE KEEPING OF CERTAIN OTHER ANIMALS AND FOWL WITH IN THE TOWN LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF HUGO, COLORADO; PROVIDING FOR PERMITS FOR SUCH OTHER ANIMALS AND FOWL; PROVIDING A PENALTY; AND REPEALING ANY ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the keeping of certain animals and fowl within the Town without sanitary regulations promotes fly and rodent breeding and results in an increase of disease.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE NOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF HUGO, COLORADO:

Section 1. Definitions,

The word “animal” or “animals” herein shall include any cattle, horses, mules, sheep, goats or other hard-hoofed animals.

The word “fowl” shall include chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, quineas, pigeons and like fowl.

The word “person” shall mean any person, persons, firm, partnership, corporation, or association.

Section 2. Permit required.

No person shall keep or maintain rabbits, or fowl within the corporate limits of the Town of Hugo, unless such person has a valid permit so to do, and no animals, rabbits or fowl shall be allowed to run or fly at will.

Application for a permit to keep rabbits or fowl shall be made in writing to the town Clerk. Following application, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hugo, Colorado shall cause the premises to be inspected and if all conditions herein provided are complied with shall authorize issuance of the permit. A permit shall continue to the end of the calendar year unless revoked as herein provided.
